
West Point's Downtown River Park and River Trail



Background

West Point is fortunate to have one of our state's greatest natural resources in our city: the Chattahoochee River.

Through past efforts, boat launches and a 0.2 mile loop trail have been built. The city has also acquired nearby land along the river and is ready to take next steps to connect us all to this asset.



Vision

The proposed project would create a half-mile riverwalk by connecting the existing 0.2 mile loop trail to a 0.3 mile, ADA-accessible concrete trail. The final goal is to also connect to a proposed trail originating from our neighboring city of Lanett.

The project also would also install signs along the water trail to help users locate nearby boat ramps. This riverwalk is intended to be an amenity to residents and visitors.

The site has an active loop trail that is ideal to connect to new riverwalk segments. Water trail users can put in kayaks and canoes at the existing boat launch.

Much of the site is wetlands and can serve as passive recreation for wildlife habitat, nature viewing, and stormwater capture.


